OLD FIRES - NEW KEEPERS

Warmth from Nebagamon's fires continues to radiate ever brightly. Only the "keepers" of the fires have changed. Muggs and Janet Lorber, ÇN's Founders, started it all in 1929 with 43 campers and 10 counselors. After working with the Lorbers from 1955 to 1959, Nardie and Sally Lorber Stein then kept the fires burning from 1960 through the 1989 season. By then, camp had 230 campers and a staff of 125. In 1988, Roger and Judy Wallenstein of Chicago became Associate Directors and owners of camp, and in 1990 assumed full responsibility for Nebagamon's direction. Nardie and Sally continue to serve as Consulting Directors.

As many readers know, Roger was a CN camper in the 50's, became a staff member, and along with Judy. joined the administrative staff in 1986. He has a background in journalism, educational psychology, coaching, and taught at the Francis Parker School in Chicago for 15 years. Judy's experience is in education, social work, and food management. Roger and Judy are highly qualified as camp directors, but beyond their paper qualifications are their qualities of commitment, humor, intelligence, warmth, and energy. They are dedicated to the spirit and values of Nebagamon. With 2 very successful seasons under their belts, they will carry Nebagamon forward with a unique blend of dynamism, wisdom, and tradition. We hope each of you can meet Roger and Judy when they are in your city for CN Winter Reunions next Fall and Winter. Their schedules will appear in future Keylogs.

CAMP NEBAGAMON TODAY

"Make new friends, but keep the old."
"Let's learn to welcome and accept differences."

These have been major goals of Nebagamon since its inception, and were reflected in the original 1929 camp family, which had 44 campers from 15 cities and 9 states. (See below)

Nebagamon remains committed to this diversity, though this means many weeks on the road between seasons, holding reunions, and presenting camp in communities throughout the country. In 1974, Nebagamon began accepting boys for 4 or 8-week sessions. Thus, while we still have a total of 230 beds, the number who can attend camp each summer has increased. In the 1991 season, Nebagamon welcomed 328 boys from 51 cities in 28 states, as well as 24 boys from Mexico, Denmark, England, Spain, France, and Japan. Our 125-person staff came from 21 states, as well as Mexico, Denmark, England, and New Zealand.

Sharing time and space at camp with people from all over the country and world is personally enriching, and broadens horizons. Our Alumni Association continues this tradition, as indicated by the diversity of zip codes and countries on the CNAA mailing list.


JULY 25th - A CNAA PICNIC REUNION IN YOUR CITY


