A WORD FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Dear Camp Family,

I cannot express enough how thankful I am for the support that you have shown for camp, and me and the team in the past year. As you know, this has been a pivotal year in Nebagamon's history as we've undertaken our first leadership transition in twenty-one years. Your investment in Nebagamon's ongoing success throughout this transition has been humbling and heartwarming.

Just as I imagined when I became the camp director, my first off-season has been a ton of fun! I especially enjoyed visiting our camp family across the country. Holding twenty-four reunions for

current campers and alumni, it was so nice to connect with our community and create space to reminisce on summers past. Thank you to those who attended reunions this year.

This off-season has included a lot of learning too. I am so fortunate to be surrounded by a leadership team with decades of camp experience who have supported me with patience as I've learned the ropes, including our associate director Louis Levin, longtime caretakers Andy Mack and Joe Crain, as well as Steph and Adam who graciously remained on the team throughout this

winter to ensure that the transition went as smoothly as possible. Our full-time crew was bolstered this winter by two new hires. In the fall, Bob Striker ('78-'81, '83-'85, '87-'88, '91) joined the team as our director of finance, and, just last month, Larry Held (1974-'78, '83-'92, '14-'17, '23-'24) joined us as a new associate director. Both Bob and Larry bring with them a deep dedication to Nebagamon, institutional knowledge, and impressive professional experiences and skill sets conducive to ensuring that Nebagamon's timeless traditions and values remain steady as we guide camp into the future.

The leadership team and I are gearing up for what is sure to be another amazing summer at Camp Nebagamon, and we can't do it alone. It will take 130 dedicated seasonal employees to put the gears into motion. Thanks to Louis, who is responsible for seasonal hiring, our staff is almost entirely in place! Across the board our seasonal team is filled with folks committed to making a positive difference in the lives of children.

Another highlight of this off-season for me has been meeting prospective families. When families express interest in sending their sons to Nebagamon, we set up meetings to get to know one another and to tell them all about camp. I've loved building relationships with these families and helping them through the process of deciding to enroll their sons for camp. I am also grateful for the members of our camp family who have recommended Nebagamon to new families, allowing our community to continue to grow.

This summer will be unique. After 13 years with Camp Nebagamon, Joe Briggs has stepped down as associate director. His impact on our campers and community

cannot be overstated and he will be sorely missed. This will also be Nebagamon's first summer in twenty-one years without Steph and Adam at the helm. In their time as directors they changed the lives of countless campers and staff members by leading based on Nebagamon's values. I feel personally indebted to them for their guidance since my time as a camper and grateful for their delicate stewardship of the institution.

With the changes that Nebagamon has undertaken comes excitement. I'm looking forward to working with our stellar full time team and seasonal staff to build on the foundations laid by those who came before us. I'm eager to steer camp into a future where the need for summer camps is more apparent than ever. Again, thank you all for your continued support of Camp Nebagamon. Our future is bright thanks to the generosity and care of our entire camp family.

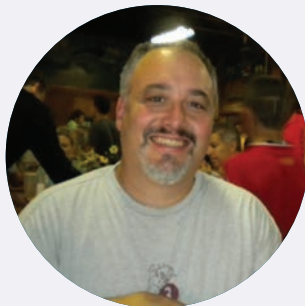

CAMP NEBAGAMON

Since its founding in 1929, Camp Nebagamon has held true to its original vision of a Northwoods residential camping experience that builds a healthy community and develops a positive sense of self through immersion in nature, challenging experiences, laughter and fun. Initially a family-run business, Nebagamon has recently transitioned to a non-profit organization guided by a dedicated year-round leadership team and Board of Directors committed to preserving the cherished traditions and culture that have defined Camp Nebagamon for nearly a century.

THE NEBAGAMON EXPERIENCE

In today's increasingly digital world, the value of a summer immersed in nature and making face-to-face interpersonal connections is more relevant than ever. Camp Nebagamon makes an impact on young lives, fostering lasting values, skills, and relationships that endure far beyond the campfire's glow.

- **Lifelong Friendships:** The relationships built here are rooted in shared experience and a strong sense of community, creating connections that last a lifetime. These bonds deepen as campers and staff return year after year, and continue as part of our extended Camp Family alumni network.
- **Wilderness Tripping:** Since our founding, Camp Nebagamon's wilderness tripping program has offered transformative experiences in nature. From overnight trips for our youngest campers to two- and three-week expeditions for older boys, these adventures build a strong appreciation for the natural world and allow our campers to build self-confidence while working together as a team.
- **Choice:** With 20 diverse program areas to choose from, campers have the freedom to create their own schedules based on their interests. This unique level of autonomy encourages our campers to explore their own interests and talents, set personal goals, build agency, and gain confidence through accomplishment.
- **Inclusion:** The phrase, "This Shall Be A Place Of Welcome For All" is inscribed in 36 different languages on signs hanging outside of the Big House, symbolizing Camp Nebagamon's commitment to inclusivity. By building a community of individuals with a range of backgrounds, we enrich the camp experience and foster a deeper understanding and appreciation of the diversity of our camp family.
- **Growth:** Our staff serve as mentors supporting the social and emotional development of our campers. We focus on nurturing genuine connections, fostering personal growth, and instilling values within a supportive environment. At Camp Nebagamon we encourage safe risk-taking as kids learn from failure as well as success.
- **Fun:** Every kid deserves a place to just be a kid, and at Camp Nebagamon, smiling faces, laughter, songs, joy, and play are the foundation of the camp experience. Amidst the myriad pressures of the real world, our camp offers a daily antidote with endless opportunities for fun and carefree moments.

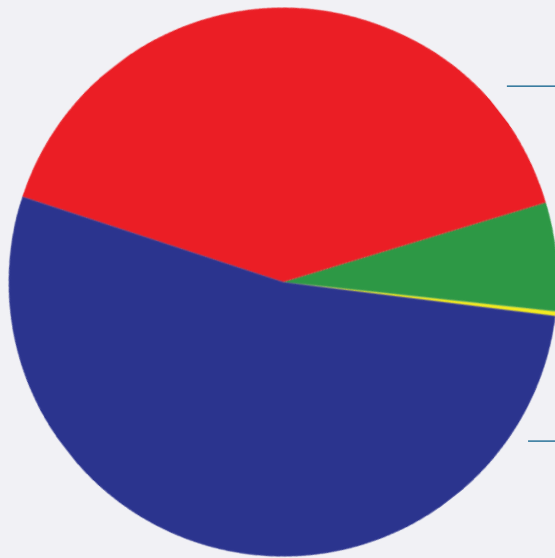

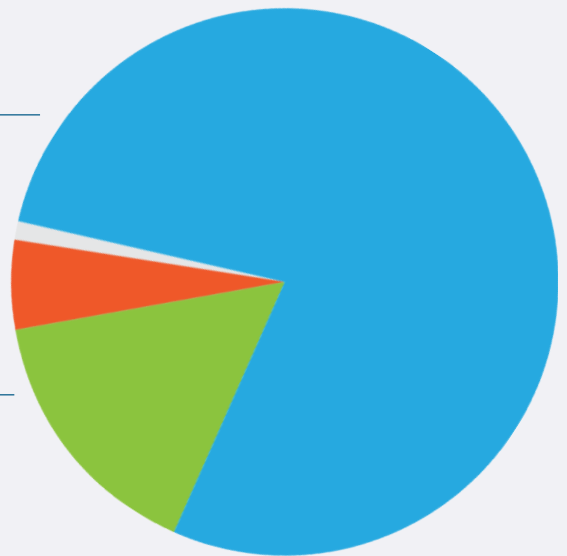

A TALE OF TWO CAMPERS

One of Nebagamon's guiding beliefs is that camp is made up of 200 individual kids—not just a group of 200 kids. This philosophy is reflected in our Camperships program, which supports campers with diverse stories, strengths, and paths to camp. Last summer, we welcomed Edgar, a 4th grader recommended by his school principal for his leadership and kindness. Edgar's family, first-generation Americans, were new to the idea of overnight camp and had understandable concerns—but they are now among our strongest supporters. We also welcomed Daniel, a 5th grader and second-generation camper whose parents, both teachers, never thought Nebagamon would be financially possible. Seeing Daniel's name added to the second-generation plaque wall and watching him thrive in his own way at camp was a moving reminder of how meaningful this program can be.

Each of these campers, like so many others, enriches the Nebagamon community with his presence—and each story is a testament to the lasting impact of the Camperships program.

THE HISTORY AND IMPACT OF CAMPERSHIPS

At Camp Nebagamon, the guiding belief that "This Shall Be A Place Of Welcome For All" remains central to our mission. In keeping with that promise, Nebagamon has long opened its gates to boys from across the country and around the world—regardless of financial means—through our Camperships program, which provides full or partial scholarships to campers. These camperships create life-changing opportunities for boys from a wide range of backgrounds, including communities historically underrepresented at camp, to experience the magic of Nebagamon for four or eight weeks each summer.

In the program's early years, camperships were funded directly by the camp directors themselves. Eventually, with the leadership of Roger and Judy Wallenstein, Nardie and Sally Stein, and a dedicated community of alumni and friends, a separate nonprofit—Camperships for Nebagamon (CFN)—was established to grow and sustain this essential work. For decades, CFN helped make the Nebagamon experience possible for dozens of boys each summer, thanks to the generosity of thousands of donors.



Today, with Camp Nebagamon now operating as a nonprofit, the Campership program has been fully incorporated into the camp's ongoing mission and fundraising efforts. While the separate CFN organization is no longer active, its legacy lives on in our continued commitment to broadening access to camp for boys from a wide range of backgrounds.

HOW CAMPERSHIPS WORK

Each year, families apply for camperships through a confidential application process, with awards determined based on demonstrated financial need. Families are asked to contribute toward tuition based on their individual circumstances, ensuring a shared investment in the camp experience.

Camp Nebagamon remains deeply committed to supporting 30-40 boys through camperships each summer—and to fostering lasting connections that continue well beyond one summer. Many of our campership recipients return year after year, eventually becoming valued members of our staff. The impact of the campership program is profound, creating access, opportunity, and a true sense of belonging for all who call Nebagamon home.

GIVING BACK

In 2022, our community came together with an extraordinary vision: to secure the future of Camp Nebagamon in perpetuity. This vision was embodied in the launch of our \$10 million “Keeping The Fires Burning” campaign. Our mission was clear: to raise the necessary funds to transition Camp Nebagamon from a private business to a nonprofit organization and establish strategic reserves, bolstering long-term financial stability and allowing our leadership to focus on creating the best summer experiences for our campers.

2025 marks the final stretch of a historic, one-time opportunity to secure Camp Nebagamon’s future. We invite all who are able – individuals, families, and cabin groups – to consider making a multi-year pledge of \$10,000 or more. Every gift brings us closer to our goal and stands as a powerful commitment to Camp Nebagamon’s enduring legacy and the life-changing impact it will continue to have on campers for generations to come.

ACHIEVEMENTS SINCE THE CAMPAIGN LAUNCH

Since we embarked on this transformative campaign, we have achieved remarkable milestones:

- **Reached 85% Of Our Goal:** Over 600 generous individual alumni and alumni families have made gifts or pledged multi-year commitments totaling \$8.5 million of the \$10 million needed.
- **Transitioned To Non-Profit Status:** Established legal and administrative infrastructure and onboarded oversight by a dedicated Board of Directors with strong community ties.
- **Completed Purchase of Camp:** Successfully raised the required funds and finalized all payments to officially acquire the Camp Nebagamon property and operations.
- **Expanded Leadership Team:** Welcomed our new Camp Director, Noah Stein, Director of Finance, Bob Striker, and Associate Director, Larry Held.



WHAT IS THE KTFB STRATEGIC RESERVE FUND?

Now that the purchase of Camp has been fully funded, all remaining support for the Keeping The Fires Burning campaign is focused on building Camp Nebagamon's Strategic Reserve Fund – a vital step toward long-term financial stability. This fund isn't for daily operations or short-term needs; it's a carefully designed resource that ensures Camp can weather economic shifts, meet unexpected challenges, and remain strong for years to come – all without compromising the camper experience or staff excellence. As the final chapter of our \$10 million campaign, this reserve is what empowers Camp's leadership to focus fully on creating transformational summers for generations to come.
